
This museum has permanent and changing/traveling programs, so check the website for the program you wish to visit.

This museum has exhibits from prehistoric people to the early 1900's. It has exhibits about explorers, pioneers, Civil War, and Reconstruction, along with Civil War uniforms, battle flags and weapons.

The museum offers special tours call "museum lessons" about certain parts of history or exhibits. These lessons last 30-45 minutes, and are available Tuesday - Friday 10:00a.m.-3:00p.m.

The museum also offers self-guided tours if you would like to tour the whole museum. There is a clipboard scavenger hunt that is also self-guided.

This museum has exhibits that deal with America's overseas conflicts starting with the Spanish-American War in 1898 and ending with World War II in 1945.

The museum discusses the wars, battles, and the outcomes. There is a deck gun from the U.S.S Nashville. There is also weaponry, military equipment, and other materials, plus posters, uniforms, and General Dwight Eisenhower's jacket.

Also included are memorials to Tennessee soldiers who died in World War I, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War.

Scavenger Hunt program that includes: a detailed scavenger hunt of the outbuilding here at Belle Meade Plantation, this can also help in gaining an Orienteering patch. This program is \$8 per scout.

Frontier Games program that includes: a tour of the Harding Cabin, playing with frontier games, learning how to play marbles, a pack of marbles to take home, and help in fulfilling the Marble Belt Loop. This program is \$10 per scout.

Everyday Life on the Frontier Program that includes: a tour of the Harding Cabin, playing with frontier games, making your own bed bug bags, and a BMP Cabin Patch. This program is \$10 per scout.

Everyday Life on the Plantation Program that includes: a tour of the Belle Meade Mansion, scavenger hunt, a tin-punch craft, and a BMP Mansion Patch. This program is \$10 per scout.

As an add on to the Everyday Life on the Frontier Program, they can add either Butter Churning if the scouts would like to make butter, or making their own corn husk people at an extra \$2 per scout to those programs.

As an add on to the Everyday Life on the Plantation Program, they can add their Civil War programs of Equip the Soldier, where the scouts learn about the life of a Civil War Soldier and see a rifled musket fired. Or they can have their Artillery program where they can learn about Civil War Artillery and see the cannon fired. These are also an extra \$2 per scout for these programs.

As for an overnight program, if you would like to include one of our field trip options as well as spend the night, then the price is \$15 per scout. If you want to take part in a program, spend the night, and have Belle Meade Plantation supply the food, then the price is \$25 per scout. They can sleep around 25 to 30 scouts with pack leaders or chaperones comfortably in our tent locations.

For parent chaperones, the price is set at \$11 each and the scout leader is free.




Tours are set up with contact above - call to set up date and timegiving number of scouts/adults, and number of cars. (Parking is limited, and Liz will inform security when you are coming).
